TAX HELP New Mexico!

The Socorro Public Library is continuing to host Tax Help New Mexico! every Wednesday from 9:00am to 3:00pm from February 1 until April 5. TAX HELP is an IRS funded program offering FREE tax return preparation services by certified volunteers. The FREE state and federal tax return preparation is for anybody older than 65 years, and anybody with a household income under \$57,000. An appointment is required; call the Library at 575-835-1114 to make an appointment starting in January. Be sure to bring all relevant W-2, 1099, 1098, K-1 forms, a photo ID, a social security card, or individual tax identification number, any receipts you are planning to deduct, and form 1095A if you bought health insurance through the Exchange. Both spouses must be present for tax returns Married Filing Jointly.

We are all set for most of next year. We have renewed our contract with the Socorro Public Schools, which has graciously donated our sales space until next August, 2023. We hope to negotiate another year at that time.

We started selling books from the new room at Zimmerly in January of this year. Due to having more space, we are able to display many more of our books. Our “weekly warriors” have spent many hours sorting and alphabetizing books to make them more accessible to our patrons. Once the sales started, we were amazed at how many books were going out the doors—hooray! After the first few months we decided to keep some statistics as to what we were selling. Here’s what we’ve learned in the past nine months.

By these counts, we have sold just over 4500 books since April. If you do the math, it’s approximately 500 items per month. We’ve had some special sales featuring Science Fiction, Cook Books and Large Print. We have also had some “Bag Of” sales where our patrons could fill a bag full of a certain genre for a set price. We’re not really sure how many books go out in a bag but it’s a lot! A huge Thank You to everyone who comes to the sales. We appreciate you so much!
